FROM OUR CHAIR

In 2020, the Otis Foundation was met with the uncertainties arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite a fantastic start to the year with a reinvigorated Board and newly appointed CEO, Ms Claire Culley, by early April we suspended providing retreat accommodation and closed the Office in Bendigo as restrictions on travel and interstate boundaries were announced. While these remain in place in Victoria at the time of this report, we have re-commenced stays in Qld, WA and SA for quests living in those states. NSW and Victoria stays are planned to re-commence in December.

As individuals we have all been affected by this public health crisis, but we can only imagine the impact that it has had on those whom the Foundation supports - not only must they deal with the pandemic challenges, but also the added burden arising daily from their breast cancer.

The direction set by the Board of the Otis Foundation for this year has been to re-engage and consolidate our existing relationships within the local Bendigo Community, whilst continuing to develop and foster national partnerships. Whilst we are proud that we have achieved national growth and offer retreat accommodation across all Australian states, we have reflected on our humble beginnings. Without the support of the Bendigo community

- both individuals and businesses
- the Foundation would not have expanded so successfully.

We have used 2020 as an opportunity to 'slowdown in order to speed up'. From a Board level, we strengthened our governance processes and I am grateful of the collegiality of my Board Directors in supporting me as the new Chair. I thank my predecessor, Mr Nigel McGuckian, for his contributions both a Director and Board Chair over many years, and also to outgoing Board Director, Ms Dianne Jack who has provided marketing expertise. The formation of subcommittees who meet in-between formal quarterly Board Meetings has further assisted in ensuring we have dedicated risk monitoring systems in place.

Importantly, our Foundation would not be sustainable without the ongoing voluntary contributions and support from our Principle Partners, Accommodation Partners, Property Donors, sponsors and the general public. Additionally, we have been humbled by random acts of kindness with bequeathed donations. We will ensure that the memory of these individuals is upheld by continuing to commit their donations towards helping others affected by breast cancer.

Finally, to those affected by breast cancer, our Foundation exists to serve you. We are inspired through your stories and your courage. Whilst our services are limited for the time being, we are certain that once they resume, the Foundation will be in a better position to serve as many of you as possible.

Despite the many challenges of the 2019-20 financial year the incredible generosity of our property donors, partners and sponsors nationwide is humbling. The impact of strangers gifting a break in their property to another stranger, is profound. The backing and belief we receive from all partners, donors and supporters is remarkable and never taken for granted. The alignment of old and new support is central to the delivery of the Otis gift and we look forward to delivering time away to more people experiencing breast cancer.

While our waiting list has grown by 20% during the COVID-19 Pandemic our world is slowly moving back towards socialising, playing and in the future open state borders. As we focus on re-commencing guest stays, we have a COVID-19 Safety Management plan in place for all aspects of our work and accommodation to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our guests, staff, volunteers and partners.

During 2020 we have placed emphasis on re-connecting with stakeholders, recognizing the value and contribution of past and present staff and supporters, and, increasing our reach through social media. As we celebrate the Foundations 20th birthday it is also timely to reflect on the contribution of the Bendigo & Adelaide Bank as our founding partner. As our relationship with the Bank has matured, we have been supported in delivering over 1,500 nights' accommodation each year for over a decade.

As we move into 2021, we remain focused on providing a compassionate, unconditional and responsive service so that individuals and families experiencing breast cancer may temporarily escape the emotional and psychological challenges that accompany a breast cancer diagnosis. This will be achieved through financial accountability as we continue to decrease our overhead expenditure and look to increase our income to ensure the legacy of Judy Burley, and the vision of Andrew Barling, Otis founder are never lost.

To manage the ever-growing waiting list, we aim to increase our guest stays by 20% each year for the next 3 years, providing a chance for an additional 1,821 individuals experiencing breast cancer to be

with loved ones and make lasting memories.

From a personal perspective I am immensely proud of the Otis staff who have experienced much change over the last 12 months including welcoming a new CEO, enthusiastically taking on broader roles and, learning to work remotely to provide continuity in the provision of the Otis gift. It is a privilege to be part of the Otis family and work with the Otis Board, Operational team and all of our amazing stakeholders and quests.

FROM OUR FINANCE & AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Otis Board established a Finance and Audit Committee in April 2020 with Anne Baker as Chair, Andrew Barling and Kerryn Hamilton as members alongside Claire Culley as CEO.

The Committees aim is to maximise the number of guest stays provided for individuals affected by breast cancer through ensuring Otis Financials are accurate, informative and comply with all regulatory requirement, investments achieve a satisfactory balance between risk and return and that the annual financial audit is robust with the Committee and Board giving full consideration to the findings and recommendations.

The Committees key objectives include:

- 1. Review and monitor the integrity of the financial reports and statements and the financial performance of The Otis Foundation, including the organisation's solvency;
- 2. Review and monitor third party regulatory requirements and compliance framework;
- 3. Review and monitor the financial reporting, payroll and related functions performed by external provider;
- 3. Oversee the management of The Otis Foundation's external investment funds; and
- 4.Monitor the performance and independence of the external auditor and ensure recommendations arising from the audit are actioned.

The committee meet to review monthly financial reports to budget, provide oversight of income and expenditure, ensure compliance requirements are met and oversee investment funds. Annual review of the year end statutory accounts, internal controls and audit reports are also undertaken before recommending them to the Board for approval.

FROM OUR RISK COMMITTEE

In 2019/20 the Otis Foundation board established a Risk Committee to support the board with its oversight of the Foundation's risk management governance.

Board chair Manny Cao nominated current board member Damian Burley to chair the Committee, considering his experience in risk management, which was endorsed by the board. Damian was joined by other nominated Committee members including Manny, CEO Claire Culley, board member Sophie Daley and later Lana Burley was endorsed by the board to join as a non-Director Committee member.

Key outcomes achieved by the Risk Committee in 2019/20 included:

• Establishing Terms of Reference, which outline the key objectives, processes, outcomes and governance requirements of the Committee.

- Formalising the Foundation's Risk Management Policy, which outlines processes within a framework to ensure the effective management of uncertainty on achieving The Foundation's mission, aims and philosophy outlined in its Constitution. Compliance with the Policy is mandatory for all Otis' employees and board members.
- Reviewing and documenting an organisation-wide risk register, which outlines the major risks faced by the Foundation. The risk register identifies the required actions to manage each risk, their likelihood, consequence and severity, in addition to controls the Foundation will undertake to affect risk mitigation.
- COVID-19 risk mitigation has occurred through suspending guest stays, closing the office with staff working from home and developing a road map to BAU in line with individual state restrictions.

Establishing a Risk Committee has been an important step for the Foundation at an important time. The Committee will enhance Otis' controls to manage the impact of uncertainty on our objectives, for the benefit of our guests and all stakeholders.


During 2019/20 The Otis Foundation was provided a unique opportunity for a family to experience an international gifted stay in New Zealand through our friends at Classic Holidays.
